#### **Eligibility:**

Any youth between the ages of 5 (kindergarten) and 22.

#### **Entry:**

A. All entries MUST be received by April 15<sup>th</sup>, however, late entries will be accepted until April 22nd for an additional charge. (Entries not accepted at S.W. W. Fair Office).

#### Include all stall fees with entry form

B. Stall fees are \$25.00 per animal and \$15.00 for Showmanship. Late Entries after April 15th: \$50.00 per animal and \$30.00 for Showmanship. Pre-Peewee Showmanship is \$5.00.

#### Please DO NOT enter 2 children to one animal

- 1. Every exhibitor is to check in with the Beef Superintendent's Office upon arrival at the fair, including Jr. Association Exhibitor's.
- 2. There will be a **NO limit of how many animals an exhibitor may enter**. Heifers, steers and cow/calf pairs only (bull calves must be six months and younger and are only eligible for the cow/calf class).
- 3. Ownership of cattle is not required unless you are in one of the Jr. Association shows, then you must adhere to their guidelines.
- 4. Animals are due at the fair on May 2<sup>nd</sup>, between Noon and 9PM. Special accommodations can be made. Please contact superintendent.
- 5. Animals must be inspected by the veterinarian before entry to barn.
- 6. If you would like to be stalled with or next to another Exhibitor, please note on your entry form.
- 7. Stall cards will be furnished if you do not have your own.
- 8. All tack and exhibits must remain until 5 PM, May 4<sup>th</sup>.
- 9. Educational Displays are encouraged!
- 10. If your animal(s) meets the requirements of any of the Jr. Breed Shows, and the additional entry fees are paid, youth exhibitors may enter. Honor all entry dates and fees.

- 11. Out of state animals must have health & brand papers.
- 12. NO DOGS ALLOWED IN BARN OR AT TRAILERS.

No sleeping in barns, deposit litter in litter cans. Good housekeeping, including barn, tack, animals, and exhibits is expected by all exhibitors. Please cooperate with management and barn superintendent.
